

The daughter of an Army colonel, Dr. Rowland grew up on various Army posts on the eastern and western coasts and in Hawaii. She attended Carnegie Mellon University and the University of Hawaii, received two degrees from the University of Southern California, and a PhD from the University of California at Berkeley. She was an English professor at California State University in Fresno for ten years before entering the Dominican Convent of San Rafael, California in 1950. At Dominican University, she taught humanities, English literature, and photography until 1974 when she was named Artist-in-Residence.

Although she studied with black-and-white photographers Ansel Adams, Imogen Cunningham, and Jerry Uelsmann, her own interest was in creating color photomontages – an area in which she was a pioneer. A member of the San Francisco Women Artists, the Royal Photographic Society of England and the Society of Photographic Education, she is listed in *Who's Who in American Art, Who's Who in the West,* and the *World Who's Who of Women* – and has twice been a recipient of an international photography award from Women in Design International.
